Get Back to Culture is an opportunity for Secondary Schools in Cornwall to undertake a creative or cultural visit or activity. It is supported by Cornwall Council. The scheme has been developed by the Culture and Creative Partnerships team at Cornwall Council and is managed by KEAP.

This is a list of creative & cultural organisations supported by Cornwall Council, along with other key Cornish galleries and some larger organisations in Plymouth.

This list has been created to ensure schools know about what is on offer from these organisations, but schools who apply to the fund can undertake ANY artistic, creative & cultural visit or experience anywhere in the country. They do not have to choose an organisation from this list.

Acorn Theatre

The Acorn is Penzance's favourite affordable theatre for live music and performing arts with a reputation for innovative programming.

For nearly 50 years we have hosted a huge variety of acts, groups and projects within theatre, dance, music, comedy, children's theatre, film, choirs, youth and community engagement. Our facilities and atmosphere attract performers from the regular national and international tour circuits to play in this remote corner of Cornwall. The Acorn also nurtures regional talent by supporting the development of new work, hosting community events and providing an affordable venue for educational arts activities.

We have a huge variety of music and theatre shows programmed for May – July, many of which will be of interest to secondary schools including:

Mohan: A Partition Story – Sunday 1 May - A piece of oral storytelling which retells Niall Moorjani's Grampa's experiences of the Partitioning of India. With first-person telling from "Mohan's" perspective the performance is moving, visceral, emotive and at times hilarious.

B D Lenz Trio – 30 June – American jazz guitarist. Together, this trio will keep you surprised with their eclectic mix of jazz standards, original jams, and pop classics.

The Emerald Dawn – 2 July - A multi-instrumentalist, symphonic progressive rock quartet, who combine elements from classical music, jazz and rock to produce their own original, distinctive and exciting sound

Suthering – 14 July - Their harmony-rich songs tell tales of struggle and triumph against all odds; of heroes from both their own lives and from stories they have found. Inspired by strong female characters in history, mythology, and personal experience, and with an unusual mix of cascading, dramatic piano; intricate, fingerstyle guitar; flute, whistles and harmonium, Suthering bring an exciting take on folk storytelling with their evocative and distinctive sound.

Bodmin Keep - Cornwall's Army Museum

Bodmin Keep is the historic home of the Army in Cornwall. This former headquarters of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry houses the museum, with more than 300 years of military history. Each of the 12,000 collection items tell stories about battles, weapons or personal letters that were written during conflict.

A visit to Bodmin Keep supports studies of war and conflict from 1702 until the present day. The museum, which is housed in The Keep, a Grade II listed building, brings alive the history of the County Regiment of Cornwall. Self guided visits cost £2 per young person.

At Bodmin Keep we offer museum-led sessions for schools and colleges covering conflict themes including the Boer War, the First World War and Second World War from £4 per young person. Full information on topics is available here <https://bodminkeep.org/schools/>

We have a Dentistry and military hygiene exhibition from Easter.

Other sessions which could be developed in conversation with schools:

1. Berlin Wall session. The museum has one of the largest pieces in the UK with colourful modern graffiti on one side and the East German side completely blank.
2. Trench art and objects that have been made by soldiers during conflict.
3. History of military psychiatry and the experiences of soldiers past and present who fought wars on the ground and in their own minds.
4. Cornwall during the Second World War through the lens of Bodmin photographer George Ellis.
5. Jewish experiences of Cornwall during the Second World War including the Kindertransport and evacuees.

Museum of Cornish Life

Housed in the Helston's historic Market Buildings the museum is spread over three floors which are all fully accessible. The Museum holds one of the largest social history collections in the South West including an extensive clothing collection and is home to the Henry Trengrouse collection telling the story of this incredible Cornish inventor.

We currently offer workshops looking at WW 1 & 2, Victorian Life and Henry Trengrouse and Marconi. **Workshops cost £3.50 per student and last two hours.**

We also have a range of loan boxes which can be borrowed for a fee of £10 per week. The boxes cover themes such as: WW2, Archaeology and Victorian Life.

We have run a variety of projects within the museum with secondary school students and are always interested to find new ways for students to work with our collection. Previous projects include:

- working with GCSE Drama students to create new devised pieces inspired by objects from the collection in partnership with Wildworks
- working with visual art students to create book designs using the collection as stimulus
- supporting students to research their local history to create a new piece of theatre
- hosting multiple photographic projects

We hold a large clothing collection as well as numerous examples of print and museum pieces which would interest students studying textiles, graphics and design technology.

From the discovery of electricity and Morse code, to fibre optics and future technology, our award-winning museum combines the wonder of science with amazing histories and tales of human endeavour from around the globe, right here where the story of communications began.

At PK Porthcurno we offer a range of curriculum-linked workshops which combine hands-on activities with time to explore the museum. We can tailor our workshops to meet your group's needs. Workshop themes include Electricity, History of Communication, Sound, Light and Waves, Secret Messages, Build an Undersea Buggy, Planet PK.

The museum is housed in the former Cable and Wireless cable station and training college at Porthcurno, including the tunnels built during World War 2. Workshops are held in our Clore Learning Space which can support formal and informal learning.

The Learning Space and all of our museum spaces except the tunnel escape steps are fully accessible.

Visiting Group Offer:

Workshop only (2 or 4 hour option available)

The museum is open for group visits from Monday to Friday all year round during school term time. Full day visits usually start at 10am and finish at 2pm, but we can be flexible. Half day visits (2 hours) usually start around 10am or 2pm.

Cost: The admission price for groups is £6 per child, with no charge for additional adults, and includes a workshop in the Clore Learning Space as well as a facilitated Museum tour. This includes VAT, and a lower charge applies for visits of two hours or less.

Tate St Ives & Barbara Hepworth Museum and Sculpture Garden

Tate St Ives exhibits the work of artists with close links to St Ives such as Barbara Hepworth, Naum Gabo, Alfred Wallis and Mark Rothko. It also has a programme of exhibitions from national and international artists. Upcoming exhibitions:

Ad Minoliti's colourful and geometric paintings - Artist Ad Minoliti draws on the rich legacy of geometric abstraction in Latin America and presents alternative universes influenced by feminist and queer thought. 28 May – 30 Oct 2022

Wilhelmina Barns-Graham and Jonathan Michael Ray - An exhibition bringing together two artists connected with West Cornwall. While separated by time, as well as the media and form their works take, both artists draw inspiration from the local landscape, exploring the idea that there is more to experience in nature than can be found on the surface. 28 May – 2 Oct 2022

The **Barbara Hepworth Museum and Sculpture Garden** offers a remarkable insight into the work and outlook of one of Britain's most important twentieth century. It preserves her studio and garden much as they were when she lived and worked there. She purchased the site in 1949 and lived and worked there for 26 years until her death in a fire on the premises in 1975.

School visits to Tate St Ives and Barbara Hepworth Museum and Sculpture Garden are free for students aged 18 and under and teachers from Cornwall in formal education groups when they pre-book a visit. Please note, there is a charge for Tate-led activities in the gallery.

The Writers' Block

The Writers' Block is a unique creative writing space in Redruth where we champion the writer in everyone. Working with families, young people, schools, communities, harder to reach individuals and emerging adult writers and performers, The Writers' Block instils confidence, enjoyment and skills in writing, and helps people to find their voice and their story.

We can offer half or full day creative writing workshops for groups of up to 15 students. Themes include poetry and spoken word, fiction, journalistic writing, writing for wellbeing, blogging and travel writing, descriptive writing to name but a few. There is also an option of combining creative writing and visual art.

Led by professional writers and educators, students learn techniques to enable them to start writing when they think they have no ideas, use free writing as a tool for unblocking, gain inspiration from things around them and begin to edit, refine and redraft work. This new toolkit imparts confidence which stays with them in all areas of work. Once young people realise they have a story to tell, they will make the effort to tell it in the best possible way.

We expect to be opening our new Writers' Block in Redruth Old Library on Clinton Road in May 2022. If this is delayed, we are able to run workshops in other cultural venues such as Kresen Kernow and Heartlands.

Workshops are £225 for half day or £350 for a full day.

Wheal Martyn tells the story of the Cornish China clay industry and its people. Set within two Victorian china clay works in woodland, trails explore the history and nature of the site, with a view into a modern working pit. Our collections include waterwheels, tools, machinery and vintage vehicles.

We have a variety of Educational Workshops on offer, covering a range of curriculum areas through engaging and interactive activities.

We will be showcasing a new exhibition 'People of The Industry' until July 2022. The exhibition uses the anecdotes, experiences and memories of past clay workers to celebrate the men and women who worked in the industry for the past 200 years.

This offers a great base for leaving bags, having lunch and for any workshops that require it. We have a large picnic area and Challenge Trail, perfect for letting off steam at lunch time.
