

Our Work

The Writers' Block is a strategic cultural organisation encompassing:

- The Writers' Block at The Ladder in Redruth our flagship venue and a unique immersive space where we showcase our way of working
- The Story Republic our development programme for emerging performers and a mechanism for performing and sharing the work of our writers, from young people, to community to playwrights.
- Emerging writer development mentoring, networking and skills development
- Young Writers programme developing the writers and voices of the future
- Community projects uncovering and sharing the stories of communities
- Education & Teacher CPD tools for igniting imaginations in children and teachers

Recent projects include:

- Imagine collecting and celebrating stories from our Global Majority Community
- Climate Poetry Writers Room mentoring for emerging writers on environmental poetry and prose
- Programmes for care-experienced young people

Where we are

We run a full programme of writing and story based activity at The Writers' Block in The Ladder in Redruth. You can find out more about our current public events here <u>www.thewritersblock.org.uk/whats-on</u>

We also run projects and programmes across Cornwall and further afield with a variety of other community and cultural venues and partners such as The Minack Theatre at Porthcurno, Kresen Kernow in Redruth, Trelya in Penzance. Community and emerging writer projects in Liskeard, Devonport and Bude.

You do not have to live in Cornwall to become a trustee of our organisation. We hold 3 of our 4 meetings per year online. We welcome individuals who have national perspectives. We would ask for a commitment to attend our annual AGM and away day in person. Reasonable accommodation and travel expenses will be reimbursed.

Who we are looking for

Our diversity, skills and experience board audit has highlighted gaps in perspectives and lived experiences. Whilst our wider core and freelance team are more diverse, we want the leadership of the organisation to reflect the communities we work with, the new relationships we want to develop and the diversity of our nation as a whole.





We particularly welcome people who:

- Are aged between 16 and 30 years old
- Have lived experience of disability or long term health conditions
- Are Black, Asian or from other Global Majority backgrounds
- Identify as LGBTQIA+
- Are from working class backgrounds
- Are care experienced
- Live in Redruth and surrounding areas

We recognise that diversity is intersectional, and we do not expect trustees to be a voice for individual characteristics, or bear the burden of representation. We simply know that we make better decisions with a greater range of perspectives.

We are introducing a three year term for trustees, with the option to be re-appointed for a further three year term. Younger people are welcome to take a one year term which may fit better with their career and educational plans. Trustees can step down at any point.





Skills and experience

We are looking to diversify the skills and experience of our trustees. You don't need to be linked to the arts and cultural sector to have something valuable to offer. Nor you need previous experience of being a trustee.

Areas we have identified are:

- Fundraising
- Environmental responsibility
- Legal
- People & Culture (HR)
- Audience development
- Practicing writers
- Higher education
- Experience of furthering anti-racism and Equity, Diversity & Inclusion
- Safeguarding
- Community development
- Youth work / working at a grass roots level with young people
- National sector strategy and partnerships

The role of trustee

We do not expect all trustees to be experienced in every area of governance, but we do ask all trustees to:

- Commit to the vision and values of The Writers' Block
- Demonstrate good judgement and a willingness to engage in creative thinking
- Accept the legal duties and responsibilities of trusteeship
- Be an enthusiastic ambassador for The Writers' Block
- Take an active role in the search for funding, new partners and opportunities
- Contribute skills and expertise fully to the board's collective decision-making
- Be willing to devote the necessary time and effort to their trusteeship, and in particular be available to attend four board meetings per year, support the leadership team, attend events as appropriate
- Work effectively as part of a team





The legal duties of a trustee:

- Support and provide advice on the purpose, vision, goals and activities of The Writers' Block.
- Approve operational strategies and policies, and monitor and evaluate their implementation.
- Oversee financial plans and budgets and monitor and evaluate progress of The Writers' Block.
- Ensure the effective and efficient administration of the organisation.
- Ensure that key risks are being identified, monitored and controlled effectively.
- Review and approve financial statements.
- Provide support and challenge to the Development Director in the exercise of their delegated authority and affairs.
- Keep abreast of changes in The Writers' Block's operating environment.
- Contribute to regular reviews of The Writers' Block's own governance.
- Attend Board meetings, adequately prepared to contribute to discussions.
- Use independent judgment, acting legally and in good faith to promote and protect The Writers' Block's interests, to the exclusion of their own personal and/or any third party interests.

Each trustee will be assigned a role, dependent on their skills, experience and interests. Being a trustee is a voluntary role, but we are able to pay travel and childcare expenses to enable you to attend board meetings and organisational events.

Safeguarding - all trustees should ensure that they are aware of their safeguarding responsibilities and take responsibility for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of adults and children & young people. This will include completing an Enhanced DBS check.

Governance & Organisational Structure

The legal name of the organisation is Kernow Education Arts Partnership Limited. It was created in 2001 and is a Registered Charity No. 1095166 and a Company Limited by Guarantee No. 4253902. The registered office is The Villa, Scorrier, Redruth TR16 5AU.

In 2014, the organisation changed its role from a service organisation to a producer of original work. The legal charity name of Kernow Education Arts Partnership became less relevant over the intervening years, and from March 2025, the charity will trade as The Writers' Block. The legal name and the governing documents will be changed to reflect this.

The charity currently has a board of 6 trustees, who are also Directors of the Limited Company.

The board is led by Lindsey Hall, Chair of Trustees. The treasurer is Ian Abrahams. The board convenes smaller working groups as required.



The staff team are:

Helen Reynolds, Development Director Grace Davies, Venue & Programme Manager Connie Crosby, Artistic Director of The Story Republic (freelance position)

The organisation works with around 15 freelance Associate writers and performers each year who deliver the core of our work, along with a further 30 additional freelance writers, performers and artists.
